

## **DIRECTOR OF YOUTH MINISTRY – TRINITY EPISCOPAL CHURCH, Part Time**

## JOB DESCRIPTION:

Develop, enhance, and encourage a highly relational ministry by building positive, long-term relationships with Trinity youth (6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade) and parents. The Director of Youth Ministry will work with clergy, staff, and various lay ministries to develop, promote, and enhance Christian commitment, discipleship, and spiritual growth in our youth.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Develop a vision for youth ministry together with the clergy, staff, and youth, setting specific and measurable short- and long-term goals.
- Develop, train, and support volunteer adults to assist with every aspect of this ministry to provide a safe space for every young person who attends
- Oversee the Christian formation of young people, choosing and/or developing curriculum for youth grades 6-12, teaching or providing for the teaching of Sunday morning classes, Bible studies, etc., in cooperation with other parish Christian formation efforts.
- Plan out and execute the EYC yearly calendar that will include Sunday morning Christian Formation, EYC gatherings on and off-site, fundraisers, outreach projects, Diocesan events (Happening, Retreats), summer mission trip & Youth Confirmation.
- Function as a professional and responsible member of the staff, answering to the Director of Family Life and clergy on issues such as time off, sick leave and specific office hours.
- Build relationships with other youth ministers in the community, and the Episcopal Diocese of Texas to benefit from other's experience, ideas, and prayer support.
- Schedule regular weekly check-ins with the Director of Family Life to provide accountability, support, and encouragement.
- Communicate youth ministry opportunities through Constant Contact, Remind (text), the Trinity e-newsletter, Trinity social media outlets.
- Document Trinity EYC events and gatherings by taking pictures for publication and promotion of Trinity's EYC program.

## **PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Commitment to Christ, the Church and young people. Worship at Trinity Episcopal Church on Sunday mornings and services throughout the liturgical year.
- Have a working knowledge of child development, youth culture, adolescent spirituality, and age-appropriate phases and relationships.
- Prior experience working with youth in parish youth ministry, camp or mission setting.
- Demonstrate the ability to work with a volunteer team to design, develop, and implement a vibrant, comprehensive, growing, and sustainable ministry.
- Computer literate with knowledge of MS Office and the ability to learn new software.
- Must pass Episcopal Diocese of Texas Background Check
- Must obtain Safeguarding God's People certification.
