How does it invite, welcome and connect persons into the life and ministry of the congregation?

Look Outside

In what ways is your congregation connecting with:

- its neighbors within a mile or two of its current location?
- people who are not participants in your congregation, particularly teens and/or young adults?
- -other congregations, particularly Episcopal congregations, in order to serve others in formation or human needs?
